He was particularly known for taking the annual club photo. Our annual picnic was held at the home of Ed Novatski where Ken would climb the roof to take a group photo of the members and their cars. Typical Kenny!

Ken also was known for his 'bowling nights'. At first, we bowled at midnight, but as we got older, the bowling got earlier. Many of us remember Ken bringing his son Kenny (KWK2.) He is now grown and is a wonderful guy like his Dad.

Kenny loved his yellow Vette (aka the "Electric Banana") and there were other Vettes through the years as well. He was famous for talking about 'the chicken coup'. Whatever you might be looking for, ask Ken as he just might have it 'in the coup'.

Our connection with Kenny began in 1988 when Lenny became a member of Corvette Express and I followed a few years later. Through all the years we worked with him you could always depend on Kenny to provide some comic relief. But one thing is for sure...he cared deeply about the club he started with Greg. He also cared deeply about his family and friends.

When Kenny had the first stroke, I spoke to him while he was in the hospital and told him we loved him. His response was "right back atcha!" Typical Kenny.

Kenny was a great guy with a kind heart and was definitely one of a kind. Please remember Kenny, Chris and their son Kenny in your prayers. Rest in peace my friend...

## **Remembering Ken Kotacska**

The following tribute to Ken Kotacska was written by Bill Zide.

I joined the club in 1991, the same year we purchased our 1st Vette - the '86 "ARed1". KWK (Ken Kotacska) and Dino Lambros were the first club members I met when I attended the club's annual car show at Future Chevrolet on Rt 34 in Matawan (all 3 now gone and only memories). It was KWK's positive outlook and friendly nature that sealed my interest in joining Corvette Express. I was not to be disappointed.

Many of you may not know that KWK had a Yellow (C3) Corvette with an L98 motor that he called the "Yellow Banana". I recall that he once brought it to either our club show or the Englishtown show. It created quite an uproar since the question always seemed to circulate at club meetings whether KWK actually owned a working Vette.....

Kenny used to talk about all the cars he had in various stages of repair at his "coop", an old chicken coop building that he owned in Sayreville or thereabouts. He used to extend invitations to club members to visit the "coop", almost as if it was a museum. Alas, I never took advantage of the opportunity to do so, something I have come to regret when he sold the coop several years ago.

One thing about KWK is that all his cars were always "works in progress" & he would regale us with humorous stories of how he obtained the cars and the parts to work on them, often by bartering his roofing business.

KWK was a roofer by profession, always enjoying heights and, it was said, having his head up in the clouds. KWK was the driving force behind the club car picture taking session, an annual event, that he promoted for many years at the club picnics. The picture used to be the mainstay of the club's home page. A few of us would plan the car layout and it was Kenny's job to climb his giant ladder or ride the cherry picker with a plethora of club member's camera around his neck taking pictures of all the Vettes from lofty heights. He, of course, would have the prints for sale at the next club meeting.....

KWK was an avid collector of Vette catalogs and the yearly GM Vette model display cars. He would contact his dealer friends to secure catalog copies and purchase case(s) of the dealer models. All of the dealer display models in my focused collection were purchased courtesy of KWK. When we bought our '18 C7, I talked the salesperson at Kerbeck into giving me a couple extra C7 catalogs as they apparently were hard to get. KWK was delighted when I gave him a catalog, as he was no longer able to get copies from his source.

Kenny's concern for the future of the club was reflected in his promoting the establishment of an advisory board, made up of past presidents, who could share their knowledge & experience with club members assuming executive responsibilities. The advisory board he created met periodically and functioned for a few years. As the club evolved and interests shifted, the club membership decided that the advisory board, with its restricted participatory criteria, was no longer needed and we moved on.

Not to be diminished, the club's success and growth are a direct result of KWK's commitment and sustained interest in Corvette Express. I for one, am honored to have had KWK be a part of my life's experience.

If our spirits survive in some form, I am certain that KWK will be monitoring the club's future and pleased that members continue to enjoy their interactions as a club.






