From there, some took the way back to the hotel and others did a small detour to visit "Paradox Brewery".

Delicious dinners were served at "La Bella" and "Red Fox," followed again by happy hour in the hotel's lakeside backyard.

The following day on Monday, it started out a bit rainy, but the sun was shining by the time we left the hotel.
