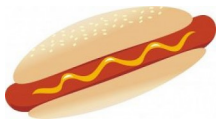

September 19 - Lighthouse Tour



The day started early and chilly at Sandy Hook, with thirteen intrepid club Corvettes and 25 club members. The first stop was at Sandy Hook Light, first lit in 1764 and the oldest surviving lighthouse in the U.S. Next, was the Twin Lights lighthouse in Navesink, erected in 1862, replacing an older light first erected in 1828. As an interesting piece of information provided by a park Ranger, the reason for twin lights was to allow ships to differentiate this light from the Sandy Hook light, on approach to NY harbor.

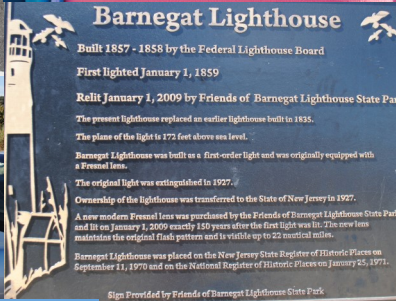
We next headed for LBI & the Barnegat Light which was commissioned in 1859, replacing two earlier lights that had been damaged by high water and rough seas. This light stands 169 feet tall and is surrounded by breakwaters built to protect it from the sea currents.

We took a break for lunch in Barnegat, and with limited seating due to Covid restrictions, half the group ate at Kubel's & the others at Mustache Bill's. We then proceeded south on Rt. 9 past the Tucker's Beach replica light in Tuckerton. Last on the tour was the Absecon Light, standing 171 feet tall in the middle of Atlantic City and first lit in 1857. Absecon is the tallest light in NJ and the third tallest masonry lighthouse in the U.S.

Our final stop of the day was at Kerbeck's, where we enjoyed a private viewing of more than two dozen C8's in all colors and option packages. Unfortunately for us, all were wearing "SOLD" tickets! However, it was a great opportunity to do our own "fantasy shopping" before placing our own orders!
