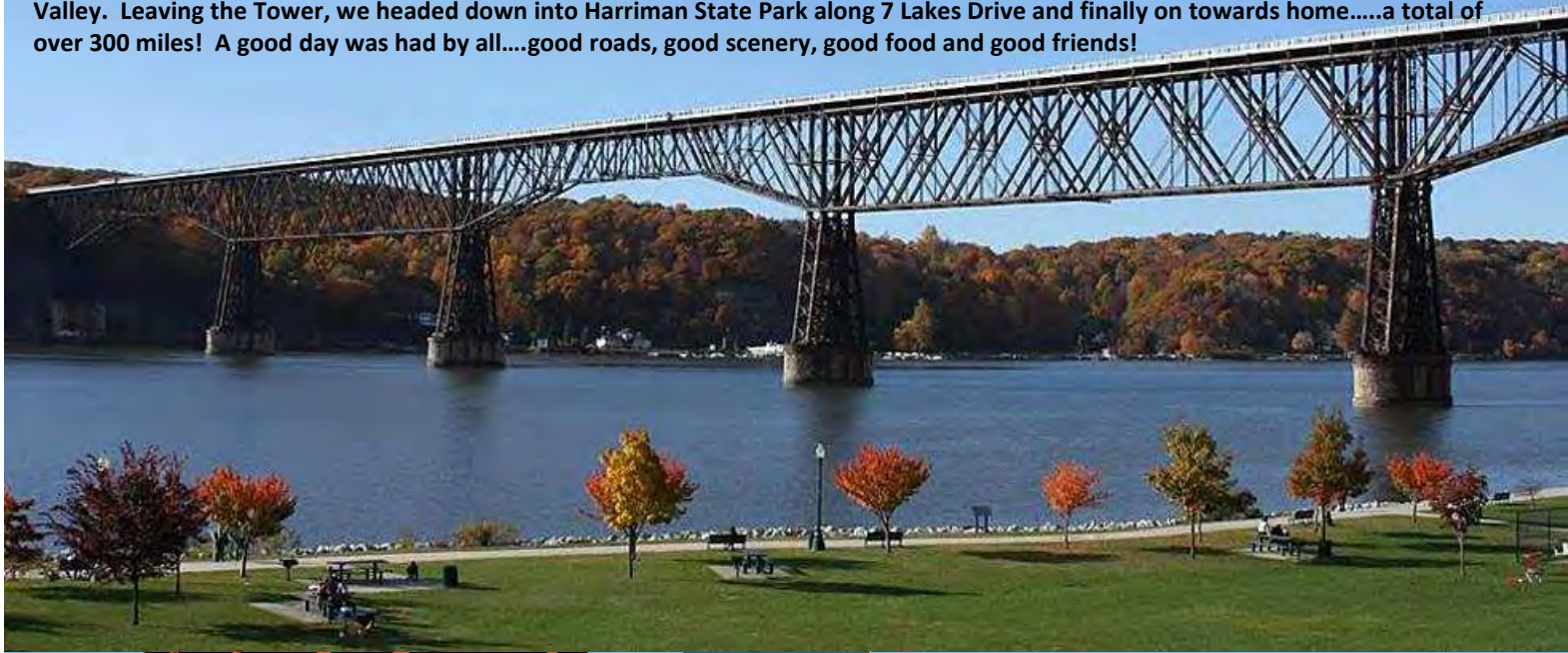

Walkway Over the Hudson - August 3

Eight club cars gathered at the Cheesequake rest stop, bright and early. It was "top down" weather for some, and we were off for the day's adventure. We headed up to the NY Thruway, and the first stop was at the Sloatsburg rest area for a "health break." We then continued north on the Thruway to I-84 & Rt. 9W to the Walkway Bridge on the Highlands NY side of the Hudson River. Our intrepid crew walked the entire length of the bridge....1 1/4 miles each way (at least some of us did). The walkway is 212 ft. above the river and the views, both north & south, are amazing. Facilities at both ends of the bridge are excellent with clean restrooms, snack vendors and plenty of shaded sitting areas. We left the Walkway and headed back south on Route 9W for a great lunch at the Alexis Diner in Newburgh. Some had to leave early after lunch to get home, and the rest of us continued south on 9W over Storm King Mountain, past West Point and into Bear Mountain State Park. We drove up to the Perkins Tower for spectacular views of the Hudson River Valley. Leaving the Tower, we headed down into Harriman State Park along 7 Lakes Drive and finally on towards home....a total of over 300 miles! A good day was had by all....good roads, good scenery, good food and good friends!

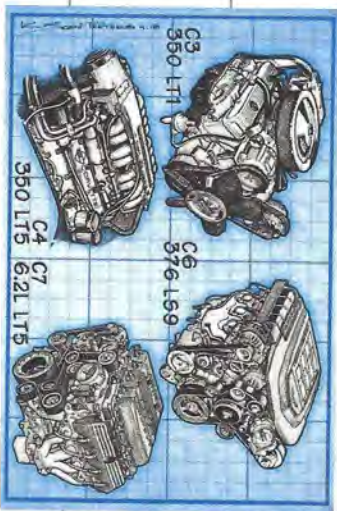

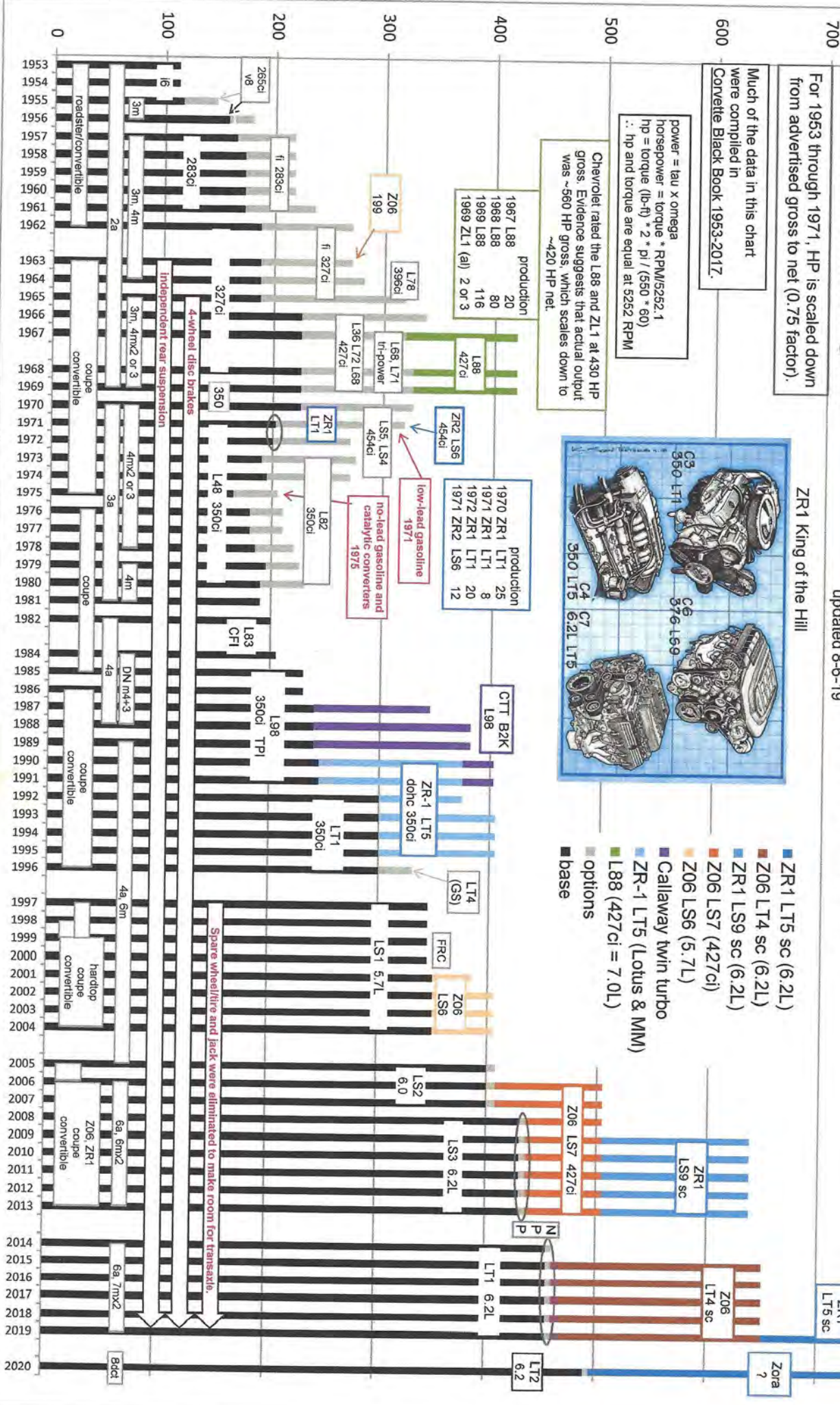
